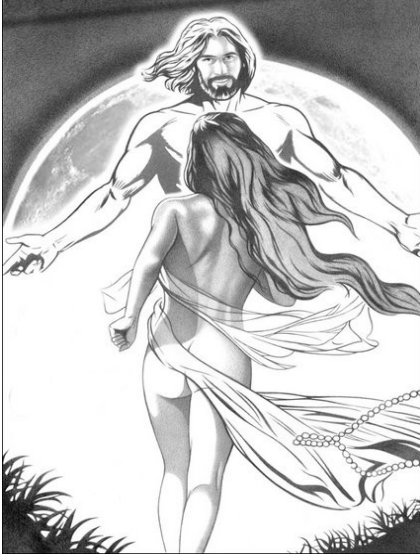


"Unveiling the Truth about Sex in the Bible"
